PATONS FAIRHAVEN 100g balls

Colourway 1

Quantity (9000 Fleece) 1 1 1

(9006 Neptune Fleck) 1 1 1

Use only the yarn specified. Other yarns are likely to produce different results.

NEEDLES AND EXTRAS

- 1 each 6.5mm (UK 3) and 7mm (UK 2) circular knitting needles (both 40cm long), and a set of 7mm double-pointed knitting needles or size needed to give correct tension.
- marker.
- wool needle for finishing.

TENSION

13.5 sts and 18 rounds to 10cm over stocking st, using 7mm needles.

To work a flat tension square to imitate rounds, using two 7mm **double-pointed** needles, cast on 20 sts.

Knit 1 row (do not turn).

Slide sts to end of needle, ready to work first st again, looping yarn loosely across back.

Knit from the same direction until 26 rows have been worked.

Cast off loosely.

Check your tension carefully.

If fewer sts to 10cm use smaller needles, if more sts use larger needles.



BEANIE

Using 6.5mm circular needle and 1 x 1 Rib Method, cast on $\bf 58$ (60- $\bf 62$) sts.

Join to work in rounds, taking care not to twist cast-on sts.

Place marker on needle to indicate beg of rounds. **NOTE** – Slip marker in every round.

1st round – * K1, P1, rep from * to end. Last round forms rib.

Rep 1st round until rib measures 8 (9-10) cm. Change to 7mm circular needle.

Work in stocking st (every round knit) until Beanie measures **17** (22-**24**) cm from beg.

SHAPE CROWN -

NOTE – Change to **set** of 7mm **double-pointed** needles when sts no longer fit comfortably on circular.

Size Child only -

1st round – * K2tog, K7, sl 1, K1, psso, K1, K2tog, K9, rep from * once, K2tog, K7, sl 1, K1, psso, K1 ... 50 sts.

Size Small Adult only -

1st round - * K2tog, K7, sl 1, K1, psso, K1, rep from * to end ... 50 sts.

Size Large Adult only -

1st round — K2tog, knit to last 3 sts, sl 1, K1, psso, K1 ... 60 sts.

Work 2 rounds.

4th round – * K2tog, K7, sl 1, K1, psso, K1, rep from * to end ... 50 sts.

All sizes ... 50 sts.

Work 2 rounds.

Next round — * K2tog, K5, sl 1, K1, psso, K1, rep from * to end ... 40 sts.

Work 1 round.

 $\begin{tabular}{ll} \textbf{Next round} - \textbf{*} & \textbf{K2tog}, \textbf{K3}, \textbf{sl 1}, \textbf{K1}, \textbf{psso}, \textbf{K1}, \\ \textbf{rep from * to end} & \dots & \textbf{30 sts}. \\ \end{tabular}$

Work 1 round.

Next round – * K2tog, K1, sl 1, K1, psso, K1, rep from * to end ... 20 sts.

Next round - * K2tog, sl 1, K1, psso, rep from * to end ... 10 sts.

Break off yarn, thread end through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

TO MAKE UP

Fold back brim.

TENSION IN THE ROUND



Using **circular** or 2 double-pointed needles, cast on required number of sts.

Knit 1 row (do not turn).

Slide stitches to end of needle, ready to work first stitch again, looping the yarn loosely across the back.

Knit from the same direction until 15cm in length has been worked. Cast off loosely.

USING A CIRCULAR NEEDLE




After casting on the required number of stitches onto the circular needle, bring both ends together to begin working in rounds, taking care not to twist the cast-on edge. The end with the ball attached will be on the right.

CASTING ON IN 1 X 1 RIB

Use this Method if the 1st round reads –

* K1, P1, rep from * to end, or if the 1st row reads – K2, * P1, K1, rep from * to last st, K1.

Make a slip knot and place on left needle. Insert right needle into the loop knitways and knit a stitch, slipping the newly created stitch onto left needle.



1. Insert right needle purlways between last 2 stitches and purl a stitch.



2. Slip this stitch onto left needle.



3. Insert right needle knitways between last 2 stitches and knit a stitch, slipping this stitch onto left needle.

Repeat last 3 steps for the required number of stitches, ending with one knitways stitch for an even number (rounds), or two knitways stitches for an odd number (rows).
